'APOK 32' - Parish Discernment and Planning Day

You are warmly invited to join us for our APOK 32 Vision and Mission Planning Day on Saturday, 20 September 2025, 9.00am-3.30pm, at the Lindisfarne BoatHouse, Cudgen (Point Break Circuit, Salt).

Our theme is grounded in Scripture:

"See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19)

"Put out into the deep." (Luke 5:4)

Together, we will pray, reflect, and dream about where God is already at work on the Tweed Coast, and discern Spirit-led initiatives for the spiritual, numerical, and financial growth of our parish.

This day is for the whole congregation—not only leaders—so please come and take part. Lunch and refreshments will be provided.

21 Days of Prayer and Fasting (30 August – 20 September)

As preparation, I invite you to join in 21 days of prayer and fasting leading up to our Parish Discernment Day.

Fasting is a spiritual discipline practiced by many throughout Scripture—Moses, Daniel, Nehemiah, and our Lord himself. Jesus taught that some miracles come only through prayer and fasting (Matthew 17:21).

Fasting doesn't need to involve food or drink alone. It can be setting aside distractions—such as TV, social media, gossip, or negativity—in order to create more space for prayer. Whatever we give up, let us fill that space with prayer for our parish, our community, and the wider world.

May the Lord bless and reward you abundantly, as only He can. With every blessing,



Remembering St. Augustine of Hippo:

On 28 August we remembered St Augustine of Hippo in the Christian calendar. His words and prayer are worth pondering:

"Late have I loved you, beauty so old and so new: late have I loved You. And see, You were within and I was in the external world and sought You there, and in my unlovely state I plunged into those lovely created things which You made. You were with me, and I was not with You. The lovely things kept me far from you, though if they did not have their existence in you, they had no existence at all. You called and cried out loud and shattered my deafness. You were radiant and resplendent, You put to flight my blindness. You were fragrant, and I drew in my breath and now pant after You. I tasted You, and I feel but hunger and thirst for You. You touched me, and I am set on fire to attain the peace which is Yours."

"O Lord, in whom we live and move and have our existence; You have made us for yourself and our hearts are restless until they rest in you." Amen.



A Child-like Faith



You might think that the Parish's children's services - returning this weekend - are an attempt to 'accommodate' children in the life of the Church. There's a bit more to it than that, however. Jesus taught that the people who chose to follow Him - those we call "grown-ups" - should look to children's example for their faith.

What did He mean by this?

A child's love for their father is not a rational decision they make in the cradle. It is a trust that comes from a place of absolute dependency, and reflects the vulnerability that comes with the miraculous gift of being born as a human child. It will be years before the child can walk or talk or make decisions for themself; until then they must rely on their parents. Our love for our Heavenly Father also comes from a place of dependency as we overcome our human pride, putting aside confidence in our adult selves to place our trust in Him and his loving Fatherly care.

Praying To Our Father

Our Lord Jesus taught us to pray

"Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name.

Your kingdom come.

Your will be done

On earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our debts, As we forgive our debtors.

And do not lead us into temptation, But deliver us from the evil one.

For Yours is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever.

Amen."


An explanation

"Our Father in heaven, Hallowed be Your name..."
We come as children, not strangers. We have a relationship with God. He is both near (our Father) and exalted (in heaven).

When we say, "Our Father," we are stepping into divine relationship (Romans 8:15). When we declare, "Your kingdom come," we are surrendering our own agendas to His eternal reign (Matthew 6:10; Revelation 11:15). When we ask for daily bread, we aren't just requesting food, we are leaning into the God who provides every need (Philippians 4:19; Lamentations 3:23).

The Lord's Prayer holds the entire story of salvation-starting with provision, leading through humility, and ending in deliverance. When we are praying this, we are entering a holy dialogue with the very nature of God.

Each line of the Lord's Prayer speaks to who God is: the Provider (Philippians 4:19), the Forgiver (1 John 1:9), the Deliverer (Psalm 34:17), the King (Revelation 11:15), and the Holy One whose name is to be lifted high (Isaiah 6:3).



To pray these words is to call on His attributes, to align ourselves with His heart, and to invite His presence into every dimension of our lives. As we say, "Your kingdom come," we are embracing His sovereignty (Matthew 6:10). As we ask for daily bread, we lean into His faithfulness (Lamentations 3:23). This is relationship, worship, and spiritual formation all in one prayer. Let's get into it word by word:

And this mirrors the full gospel: God provides. We fall short. He forgives. He delivers. This is the thread of the entire Bible:

- God delivers Israel from Egypt and after that, He gave them manna.
- God delivers David from his own sin and his enemies.
- God delivers the exiles and restores their hearts.

And in the end, God delivers us through Jesus — the Bread of Life, the Lamb who takes away sin, and the Savior from evil.

Jesus didn't just teach us a way to pray, He taught the entire story of salvation in a few verses.


Parish Food Ministry


