Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ

"Give thanks in all circumstances; for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus" (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

'Kia Ora' (Hello) from Auckland

I'm writing from Auckland where we're attending the World Indigenous Peoples' Conference on Education (WIPCE). My grandmother, who lived till 104, once told me a proverb that has guided my love for travelling ever since: "A person who travels is wiser than a person with grey hair." It wasn't a dismissal of the profound respect we owe to our elders, but rather an affirmation that wisdom is not a passive result of time, but an active pursuit. It is found in the stories shared between cultures and in the humility to learn from different perspectives. I found this to be the case during the past week in the encounters we've had with people from across the globe in our shared desire and efforts to make the world kinder, more humane and just for our Indigenous peoples and other minorities around the world. I thank God for the blessings and graces of this week, and pray that our work will bear good fruits.

Graeme's Sobering Sermon

Last Sunday Rev. Graeme reminded us that Christmas is a time of joy, and yet there are also serious matters to consider. For, whilst we in sunny, tranquil, Kingscliff are blessed by prosperity, good weather and the freedom to organise Christmas markets, raffles, choirs and plays, in other parts of the world people aren't so fortunate. In Nigeria, particularly, Christians are regularly persecuted, attacked and killed by Islamic extremists who dominate the north of that densely populated country. And yet they faithfully gather in Jesus' name, despite the risk to life and limb. Let us pray that such violence doesn't reach us here, and that our devotion not be tested (but that should it be so, we would have the courage to pass the test).

(Note: In the Lord's Prayer we ask God to "save us from the time of trial". Spare a thought for our suffering brothers and sisters in Nigeria and elsewhere, when you pray).

Special St James Christmas market

THE ANGLICAN Parish of Kingscliff is goaring up for a joyful community celebration as it prepares to host the Festive Christmas Market at St James on Saturday, November 22, with all proceeds supporting the church's rapidly expanding Food Ministries.

For many years, the purish has quietly served as a vital support network for locals doing it tough, offering free takenway meals every Tuesday at St Mark's Church and every Thursday at St James Church, distributed by friendly volunteers between 11 am and 1 pm.

These long-running meal programs have become a dependsble assures of assurishment and community for residents in need.

Now, the parish is broadening its outreach with a new initiative: a weekly Monday evening soup kitchen in the St James Parish Hall.

The sit-down community dinner features hearty, home cooked meals prepared by the church's team of skilled cooks, using fresh ingredients funded through donations and events like the Christmas market.

The parish emphasises that everyone is welcome to share in the meal and fellowship.


"To ensure those programs continue to grow, organisers are inviting locals to embrace the Christmas spirit and turn out in force for the upcoming market from 7.30mm to 12noon, the event will offer an array of stalls, a breakfast barbecue, children's face painting, and five performances — including a choral group singing classic Christmas favourities," one of the organisers Jason Saltearn told The Weekly.

Note: APOKALYPSE* is a group of artistic parishioners who come together to put on plays on Christian themes. The acronym stands for "Anglican Parish of Kingscliff Artists collaborating in 'Love Your Parish' Seasonal Entertainment".






The Parish would like to thank all who helped distribute the meals through the Food Ministry this week, add both St Marks and St James. Well done all for keeping this vital long running ministry alive.


