


Preparing for Christmas

Parish Council Agrees to Disagree Well

Parish Council met on Wednesday and discussed a range of issues upon which different views are held (as well, happily, as many upon which there is general consensus).

Rev. Constantine often says that we should try to "disagree" well. On this topic, Jason made a point worth repeating, noting the difference between "putting an idea forward" and "making a decision". In the Anglican world, individuals or groups may suggest ideas for discussion (at Parish Council and other venues), but actual decisions are made through the collective wisdom of Parish Council, which relies on open discussion and prayerful discernment. Let's not discourage people from putting forward new ideas for discussion, but trust that our system of governance will produce good decisions.

Parish Strategic Map & Project Leadership

A key item on the agenda was implementing the Strategic Map developed at the Parish Discernment Day in September. That map is reproduced below and prioritises five Strategic Projects for 2026 (and the leadership team assigned to them), being:

- **SP1.** Develop a phased upgrade plan for buildings and facilities within a Master Plan. [Lead by Phil George, Steve Elworthy, Glenn Kellow, Brian Wyver, Jason Saltearn]
- **SP2.** Recruit extra LLM's, lay leaders and a Music leader. [Lead by Rev. Constantine, Peter Pine, Wendy Hawkins]
- **SP3**. Create a volunteer register; formalise the structure and publicise existing groups. [Lead by Jason Saltearn, Peter Pine, Terry McNellee]
- **SP4**. Develop and implement an upgrade plan for IT and tech. [Lead by Mike Sainsbury, Stephen Elworthy, Sam and Stuart Reid].
- **SP5**. Develop and implement a calendar of new and repeat events for 2026 [Lead by Kaz Sainsbury, Ximena de Sada]

Any parishioner who would like to join one of these teams are encouraged to let Rev. Constantine and/or the Wardens know. Your contribution would be most welcome.

As always, let us pray fervently that the Holy Spirit will empower and enable us to work together to achieve these projects for the glory of God and the salvation of souls.

Bishop Murray takes a keen interest in what goes on in our Parish, often putting tough questions to the Wardens about this or that project already underway, or looking to get his approval. So it was great when he agreed to have the tables turned and to submit to questions from the Parish in a 'Q & A' session at our 60th Anniversary event, where he led the service. Facilitated by Jason, the event put Bishop Murray in the "hot seat", giving him the opportunity to share his views on a wide range of topics, by answering parishioners questions. Amongst other things, he spoke about achieving work-life balance in his role, the Church's response to the appointment of the first female Archbishop of Canterbury, and what constitutes "best practice" for Parishes (answer: prayer).

Our Parish Support for Mission

(A message from the Parish Mission Secretary, Graeme Hodgkinson)

Since there have been new people join our parish in recent years it is probably a good time to clarify what support our parish gives to mission so that everyone understands how we operate in that regard.

The parish has a Mission Support Group (MSG) that acts under the direction of the Parish Council. Acting on the advice of the MSG and in accordance with the tradition of the parish the Parish Council has decided that as a parish we should support four Missionary groups:

Locally,

we support the Tweed Coast Christian Education Association (TCCEA).

This association includes representatives from churches in the local region that finds and supports teachers to give Religious Instruction to students in local High Schools. Funds are raised through those churches to provide salaries for the teachers and to pray that the Word of God would reach local students through them. Currently there is one teacher supported in this way (Kirsten Strong in the Kingscliff High School).

Australia-wide,

we support the Bush Church Aid Society (BCA).

This Anglican Society raises up and supports people (both clergy and lay) to take the gospel message of God's love in Jesus to remote and outback parts of Australia, as well as maintaining strong support for indigenous outreach.

Globally,

we support two missionary organisations:


1. The Church Missionary Society (CMS).

This society exists to raise up, send, pray for and fund missionaries in overseas countries. It is planned to have a speaker from CMS to bring us up to date with the work of the society before the end of the year.

2. The Anglican Board of Mission (ABM).

This mission board raises funds and prayer support for projects in other countries to assist local Christian groups to take the love of God to their own people. We use ABM envelopes in Lent and Advent to support whatever project is recommended.

Our parish sets apart \$10,000 each year to support these mission groups, giving \$2,500 to each of them. Members of the church are encouraged to give support to these organisations and pray that our Lord's Commission to his church might be fulfilled.


Parish Food Ministry


