We ask that you will make the door:

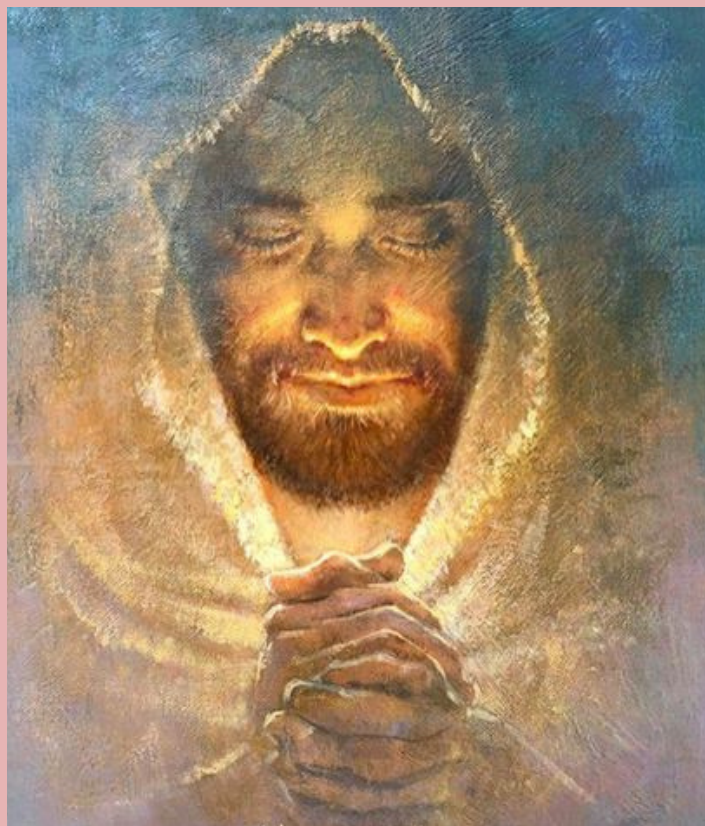
Narrow enough

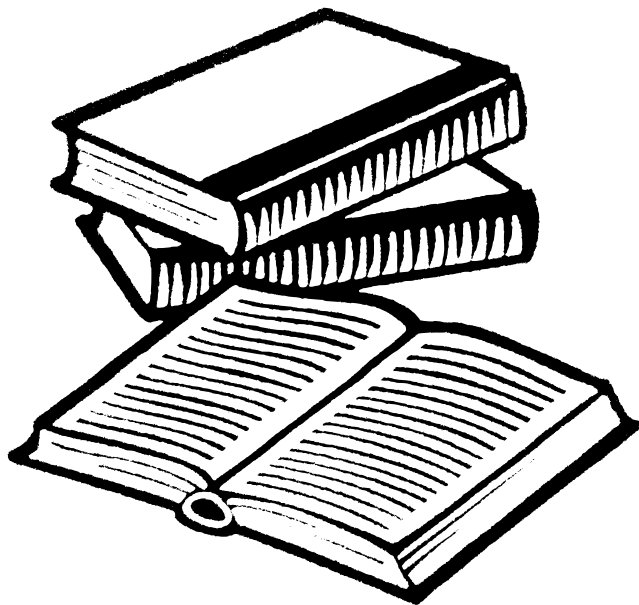
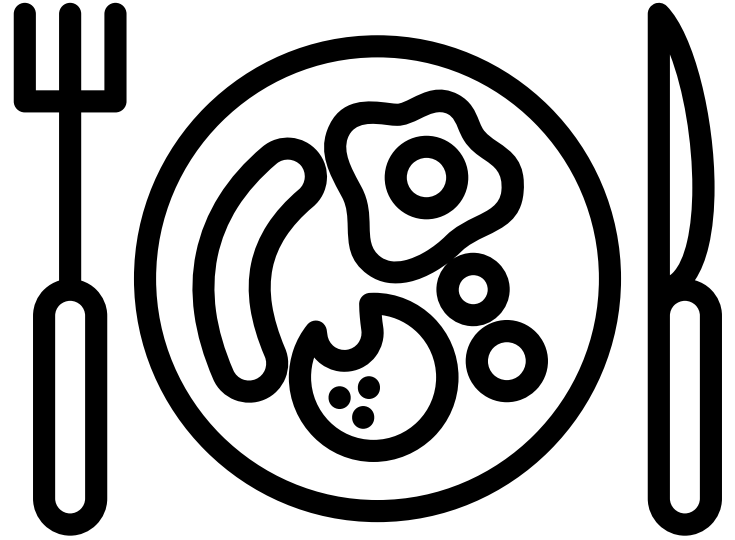
Parish Food Ministry

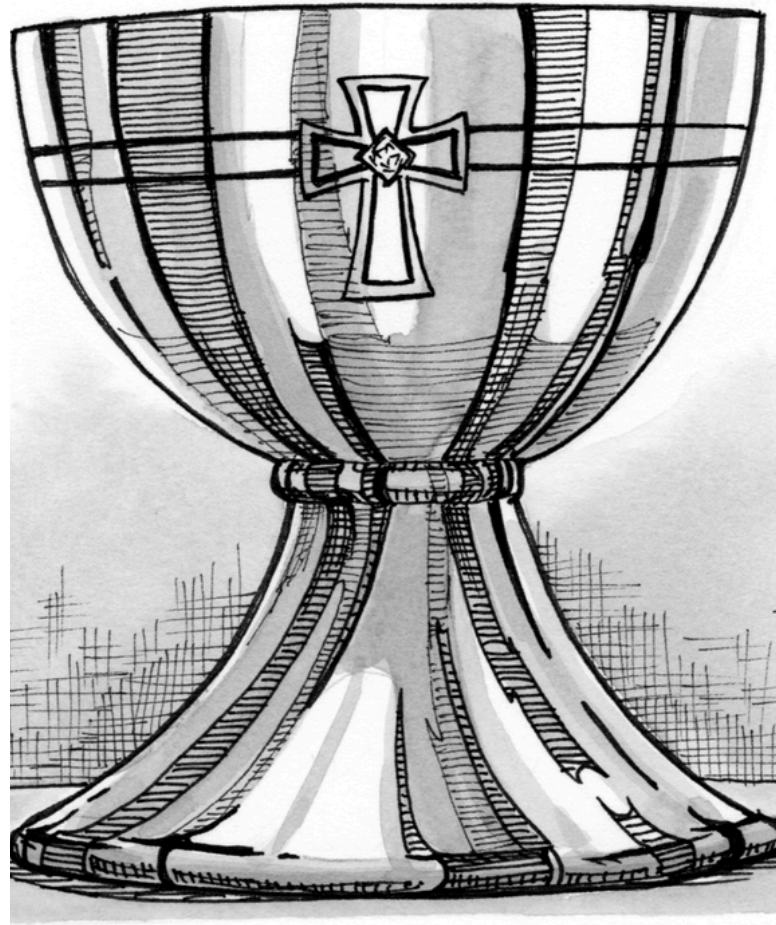
