## Letter from Constantine

Beloved Brothers and Sisters in Christ.

#### The Courage to Be Saints

"We are God's children now; what we shall be has not yet been revealed. We do know that when it is revealed we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2).

We usually celebrate All Saints Feast on November 1 annually. What is a saint and how can we become a saint? The saint is not someone in whom everyone sees God, but the one who sees God in everyone. Saints are those who put their trust in God, live with courage, and let God's grace transform them into signs of divine love. Hebrews 12: 1 reminds us that "we are surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses..." And so, these 'cloud of witnesses' are never far away from us, both in life and in death.

There's an old story of Rabbi Yehuda of Prague, famed for creating the Golem. One night he dreamed he had died and stood before the throne of God. When the angel read out the names of those welcomed into the Kingdom, Yehuda's name was not among them. He wept bitterly, and the angel said, "I have called your name—but you did not hear it." The angel explained that every person's true name is written in the book of life, but some never recognize their name when God calls because they never truly knew who they were. Yehuda awoke and prayed, "Master of the Universe, grant me before I die to hear my true name on the lips of my brothers and sisters."

Have we heard our own true name? A palliative nurse, Bronnie Ware, once said the most common regret she heard from the dying was: "I wish I had the courage to live the life I was meant to live."

To be a saint is to hear your true name and respond to God's call with courage.

There is no single pattern of holiness. Saints (canonized or not) are as diverse as humanity itself — from Mother Teresa to St James, from St Thérèse of Lisieux to St Mark's and St John Vianney, and the 'Saints next door'. Why not also Constantine, Mary, Peter, Joe, Bev, and all of us here today?

#### Rainer Maria Rilke wrote:

"Flare up like a flame and make big shadows I can move in... Give me your hand." God calls each of us: Embody me. Live me in the world. Give me your hand.

Leon Bloy puts it very powerfully, "the greatest tragedy is not to become saints" — not to live up to our God-given potential. So let us take courage. Open the doors of our hearts. Let God's love in us set the world ablaze. Let us, like the saints, make God the sole reason for our being, and so call others to salvation and fullness of life (cf. John 10:10)

Let us pray for the grace and courage to be saints -in other words, to be authentic witnesses of God's grace, and bearers of His love and joy in our world of today.

God loves you all and so do I.




# Parish Food Ministry


The Parish would like to thank all who helped distribute the meals through the Food Ministry this week, add both St Marks and St James. Well done all for keeping this vital long running ministry alive.


